EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: On March 22, 2005 a severe weather system including tornadoes, moved into the State of Georgia resulting in one fatality, numerous injuries and caused major destruction and damage to properties in Miller, Seminole and Wayne counties; and


WHEREAS: Continued adverse weather on March 25, 26 and 27 hampered and impeded recovery efforts in Miller and Wayne counties; and

WHEREAS: The assistance of the government of the State of Georgia is necessary to protect the public health, preserve the safety of the public, keep property damage to a minimum and to restore the social and economic welfare of the impacted communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OR THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That the State of Emergency previously declared on March 23, 2005 for Miller and Wayne Counties be and is hereby further extended for a period of an additional four days until midnight on April 1, 2005 or until the end of an additional period of time as may be authorized by further Executive Order.
