

WHEREAS: During the 2010 Regular Session of the General Assembly, the Members considered House Resolution 178, a proposal to amend Article III, Section VI, Paragraph V of the Georgia Constitution by revising subparagraph (c); and

WHEREAS: On May 27, 2010, the Georgia House of Representatives, by a vote of 152 yeas and 3 nays, adopted House Resolution 178 by the requisite two-thirds of the Members of the House of Representatives; and

WHEREAS: On May 29, 2010, the Georgia State Senate, by a vote of 49 yeas and 0 nays, adopted House Resolution 178 by the requisite two-thirds of the Members of the Senate; and

WHEREAS: Pursuant to Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution of the State of Georgia, both houses having adopted identical versions of House Resolution 178 by the requisite constitutional majorities, the proposal was submitted to the electors of the entire State at the General Election of November 2, 2010; and

WHEREAS: The proposed amendment appeared on the General Election ballot as "Constitutional Amendment 1" and stated, "Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to make Georgia more economically competitive by authorizing legislation to uphold reasonable competitive agreements?"; and

WHEREAS: On November 2, 2010, the electors of the entire State voted as follows: 1,633,066 electors voted "Yes"; 783,390 electors voted "No"; and

WHEREAS: The Secretary of State certified the above results and laid them before the Governor; and

WHEREAS: O.C.G.A. § 21-2-502 (f) requires the Governor to issue a proclamation declaring the results of the vote of each constitutional amendment submitted to the electors of the entire State; now

THEREFORE: I, Sonny Perdue, Governor of the State of Georgia, pursuant to the Constitution and statutes of this State, do hereby proclaim that a majority of the electors having voted in favor of the proposed constitutional amendment, Constitutional Amendment 1 is duly ratified. Furthermore, pursuant to Article X, Section I, Paragraph VI of the State Constitution, the resolution proposing the amendment providing no other date, Constitutional Amendment 1 shall become effective January 1, 2011.
