EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: There currently exists at the Georgia Institute of Technology, Fulton County,

Atlanta, Georgia, a building known as 210 North Avenue (the "Building"); and

WHEREAS: The Board of Regents at its meeting on September 9, 2009, declared by

resolution that said Building can no longer be advantageously used by Georgia Institute of Technology or the University System of Georgia and should be

demolished and removed; and

WHEREAS: It is the opinion of Ms. Linda M. Daniels, Vice Chancellor for Facilities of the

Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, that the Building can no longer be advantageously used by Georgia Institute of Technology or the

University System of Georgia and should be demolished and removed.

Now, therefore, by the power vested in me as Governor of the

STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia is hereby

authorized to demolish and remove the Building from Georgia Institute of

Technology, Fulton County, Atlanta, Georgia.

IT IS FURTHER

ORDERED: That the appropriate staff of Georgia Institute of Technology, Fulton County, Atlanta, Georgia, acting under the approval of the Board of Regents of the

University System of Georgia, is hereby authorized to demolish the Building and to have all building materials removed from the premises by public works contract; all said demolition and removal to be performed as expeditiously as

possible.
